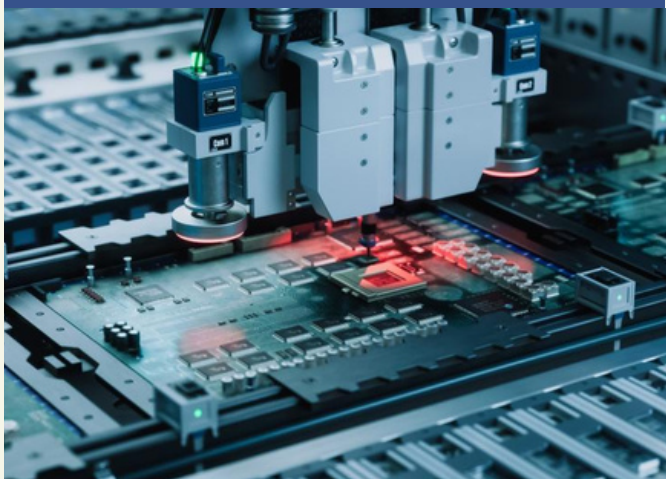


ELN REFLECTIONS: 2026 NPT REVIEW CONFERENCE

Better know a non-nuke: Brazil

In the latest episode of the Arms Control Primer podcast, host Dr Alexander Bollfrass is joined by Dr Leonardo Bandarra and Professor Carlo Patti to discuss the nuclear history and present of Brazil. The guests share their insights on the civilian and secret parallel nuclear programmes, and how the decision was made to cease the secret programme in 1990 and to set up a bilateral inspection regime with Argentina. As Professor Patti mentions: "The final decision of extinguishing this side of the project has been taken in September 1990. This decision has been taken because of the international context in a multilateral way. We have to think that it was the end of the Cold War and that the Soviet Union and the United States decided to agree on a new treaty for banning peaceful nuclear explosives. The two countries decided not to go on with their own projects with PNEs, and in that context also Brazil was approaching Argentina.
