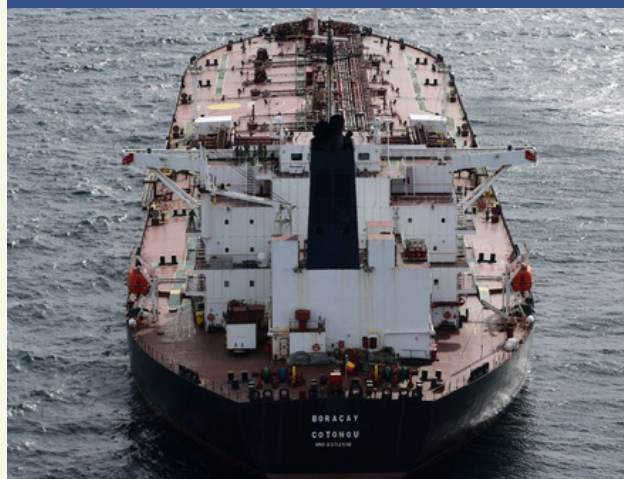
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NATO AFTER ANKARA

Host Dr Alexander Bollfrass is joined by Rodrigo Mallea and Professor Julián Gadano to discuss the nuclear history and present of Argentina. The guests share their insights on Argentina's unusual nuclear history, and how Argentina built the first nuclear research reactor in Latin America. As Rodrigo Mallea mentions: "Argentina wants to build this big nuclear programme and it wants to have 100% autonomy in terms of the control of the technologies. Argentina does not want turn-key imports, Argentina wants the know-how."
